

THE STORY-BASED CURRICULUM GRADE ONE—FAIRY TALES





Students make their own books. Here is an example of first grade Language Arts book teaching the letter B. On the right is a chalk drawing of the letter M done by the teacher.






Waldorf Schools Honor the Vast Spectrum of Human Intelligence

We expect our students to become "multidimensional." In addition to learning the academic subjects, they also develop the artistic, practical and social intelligences. They play the recorder in grade one and in grade four they begin to learn an instrument, either violin or cello. From grade one on they have Handwork and Spanish class three times a week.
